Watching the videos of the massacres in Gaza and the Levant passing by incessantly before our eyes for over a year has given birth to a strong feeling of injustice exacerbated by powerlessness. Demanding ceasefire will not be enough to liberate the Palestinian people, because the liberation of peoples colonised by imperialist states will never be achieved by pacifist slogans. We want to go further and question the current expansion of the military-industrial complex, as well as nationalist propaganda and security obsession all over the world and especially in France.

Who makes the bombs that fall on houses, the batons and grenades that rain down on our mugs, the cameras that monitor the cities and the borders, who snitch to the cops and deliver to the judges and to their prisons ? When we look into the matter, we quickly become aware of the entire chain interdependence that connects the company that manufactures and commercializes the drones tested without measurement in Khan Younes or Khartoum, to those who monitor the borders militarized by the European Union. The companies that manufacture the necessary optics and micro-components to make these technologies work are those who hunt down «the internal enemy», the metro fare dodger, supermarket shoplifter, the «undocumented» in France. By pulling on the thread, we bring down the curtain, which hides the immense fortress of the military-industrial safe where all the imperialist pigs exchange, sell and share their new toys for always better to subdue and control the populations. All this safe and deadly business is developing behind the windows of modern offices, factories in the peripheries of cities, chambers of commerce and of industry, in university research centers: War is being manufactured on the corners of our streets.

From Palestine to Kanaky, from Western Sahara to the Kurdish mountains, from Yemen to Sudan, the places where there is resistance serve as a laboratory to bring forth new technologies and counterinsurgency practices.



Then, under civilian uses, these same technologies return to our «pacified» nations, increasingly militarizing our surroundings.

We want to promote a decolonial and anti-capitalist anti-militarism. This should not be a moral pacifism, but it must be embodied in an offensive form that matches the level of commitment deployed by the revolutionaries. They fight through the path of makeshift weapons and those seized from the enemy, through desertion and resistance networks (drug transfers, distributions food, active propaganda against the war and national unity...) and their resistance must be supported.

However, our antimilitarism only makes sense if it is also part of the fight against police killings in our neighborhoods, against mass surveillance, against deaths at borders and in prisons. We hope to give concret expression to this anti-militarism through research and information work on these deadly devices.

This text is therefore an invitation to gather around an antimilitarist and internationalist assembly, public and accessible to everyone. This framework proposes to make antimilitarist issues something accessible that is not reserved for a few experts, to make information about the organization of the military-industrial complex visible, and to fight frontally against this tentacular and carnivorous industry. Let's meet around screenings, mobilizations, communal meals, concerts, and parties, which we will organize in assembly.

We therefore propose to meet on Tuesday, February 11 at 7 PM at CICP (21ter rue Voltaire, Paris 11), for this first internationalist antimilitarist assembly!
